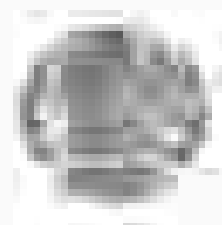

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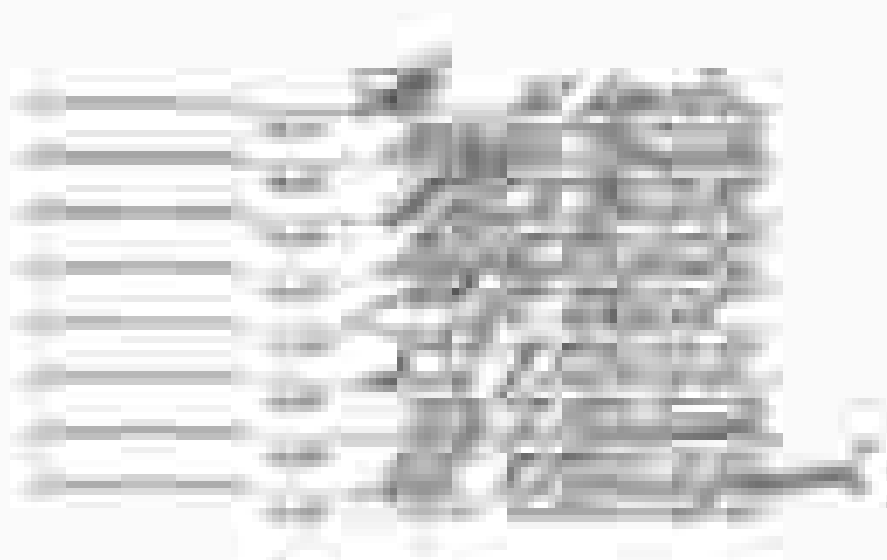
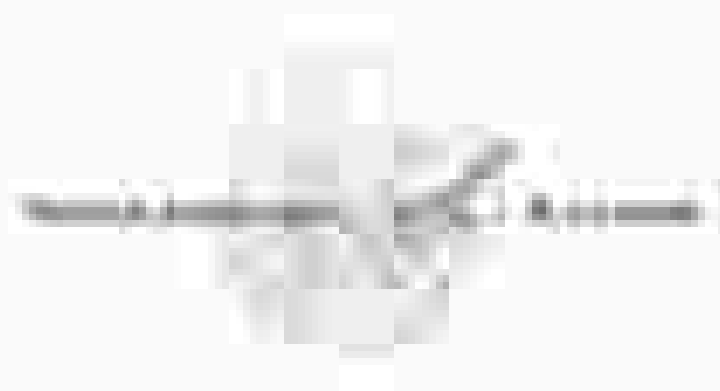

Mathematics

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Figure 1. The effect of the number of trials on the number of correct responses.

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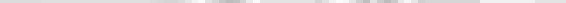

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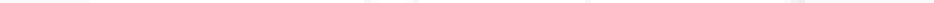
